Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Programs
Educates people about disaster preparedness and trains them in basic disaster response skills

Medical Reserves Corps Program (MRC)
Strengthens communities by helping medical, public health and others offer their expertise in times of community need

The Fire Corps

Promotes the use of citizen advocates to enhance the capacity of resource-constrained fire and rescue departments at all levels

Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS)

Works to enhance the capacity of state and local law enforcement to utilize volunteers

USAonWatch—Neighborhood Watch

Works to provide information, training and resources to citizens and law enforcement agencies throughout the country

Mental Health First Aid
